Fun Facts about The Queen

The Queen is about to celebrate her Platinum jubilee, marking 70 years on the throne and making her England's longest serving monarch in history. Here we share some fun facts about her and her reign.

- The Queen has carried out more than 21,000 engagements over the course of her reign.
- ◆ At least 35 countries have issued coinage with the image of The Queen.
- The Queen has sat for over 200 official portraits during her reign, the first was in 1933 when she was seven years old and was a portrait painted by Anglo-Hungarian artist Philip Alexius de Laszlo.
- Over 180 garden parties have been held at Buckingham Palace since 1952 and over 1.5 million people have attended a Garden Party during The Queen's reign.



- Her Majesty has owned more than 30 Corgis and Dorgis during her reign, most of which have been descended from her first Corgi, Susan, who was gifted to her on her eighteenth birthday in 1944
- In 1997 The Queen launched Buckingham Palace's first official website, in 2014 she sent her first tweet and in 2019 published her first Instagram post.
- In 2009 Her Majesty witnessed Swan Upping for the first time. This annual event on the River Thames includes the weighing and measuring of the swans and checks are made on their health and wellbeing. Since the 12th Century, the Monarch has retained the right to claim ownership of all unmarked mute swans found in a particular section of the River Thames.
- The longest overseas tour that The Queen has undertaken began in Bermuda in November 1953 and ended in Gibraltar in May 1954. She was away for 168 days and visited 13 different countries.
- During her reign, Her Majesty has received many gifts including a variety of live animals. The more unusual animals were placed in the care of zoos, among them jaguars and sloths from Brazil, an elephant from Cameroon and two black beavers from Canada.
- ◆ As British passports and driving licences are issued in The Queen's name, she is not required to have either a privilege held by her alone.
- Her Majesty speaks fluent French and has often used the language during audiences and State Visits.
- Her Majesty's Coronation ceremony was the first to be broadcast on television, as a result of which people purchased television sets in their millions. 27 million people watched in the UK alone, and television was ushered in as a mainstream medium.
- The Queen (then Princess Elizabeth) became a Girl Guide In 1937 aged 11, learning how to pitch tents, cook
 - on campfires and administer first aid. At 16, she joined the Sea Rangers: a separate unit of the Girl Guides created for those with a strong naval interest. She was made a was made a Sea Ranger Commodore in 1945.
 - ◆ In 2013 The Queen became the first Monarch to be presented with an Honorary BAFTA award in recognition of a lifetime's support of British film and television.

Popular ITV tv show Love Island has taken a stand to encourage viewers to buy second-hand clothing. In previous series of the show, contestants all wear clothing from retailers that fall into the category of Fast Fashion. Fast Fashion is the culture of buying inexpensive, mass produced clothing to keep up with fashion trends in an almost disposable manner. An estimated £30 billion worth of clothes that have never been worn are hanging in wardrobes across the UK. The



environmental impact of the production and disposal of these clothes is catastrophic and carries a very large carbon footprint. A staggering 10.000 items of clothing are sent to landfill every five minutes, equivalent to £140 million in value every year. But it's not just the impact on landfill that's an issue. It's also the amount of raw materials used to produce the items that are going to waste too. To put it into perspective, it takes around 1,800 gallons of water to make a single pair of jeans. According to the European Environment Agency in March this year, clothes use in Europe had on average the fourth highest impact on the environment and climate, exceeded only by food, housing and transport

In the upcoming series of Love Island, contestants will all be wearing a mixture of new and second-hand clothes purchased from eBay. In the past, clothes worn by contestants have sold out in minutes on fast fashion retailers' websites. This year, viewers will be able to access a "shop the look" tab via the Love Island app or eBay website where they can buy similar items to those seen on screen. The hope is that this will cause

viewers to stop and think about the sustainability of their shopping habits. Jemma Tadd, head of fashion at eBay, said

"Our goal with this partnership is get people to consider switching up their shopping habits with pre-loved fashion - whether that's taking baby steps and adding one or two items to your wardrobe, or selling something you no longer wear to make way for something else,"

The perception of buying second-hand clothing is beginning to shift from being something that people do because they can't afford to buy new to being trendy, unique and individual.

The cost of living crisis will also have an impact on the amount of people buying second-hand. With budgets tightened, many people have to think of ways to make their money go as far as it can and buying second-hand is a great way to do this. Recipe—The People's pudding

Jemma Melvin won the Fortnum and Mason competition to create a pudding to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee. Her fantastic recipe requires 20 ingredients and 5 hours to prepare which is beyond most of us! Supermarket chain Iceland have created a simpler and more budget friendly version based on her recipe that comes in at a fraction of the price at £1.56 a head for the non-alcoholic version or £2.25 for the boozy version. We share it here.

Ingredients

- x2 300g tins of Del Monte Mandarin Segments in Juice (£1.10, 300g), drained
- x4 pots of Hartleys Orange Jelly (£0.50, 125g)
- Juice of 1 lemon, using Iceland Lemons (£1.00, 3pk)
- 300ml Iceland British Fresh Double Cream (£1.35, 300ml)
- 2 tbsp Gale's Lemon Curd (£1.20, 410g)
- x1 pack Bakery Delights Cake Almond Fingers (£1.00, 7pk)
- x1 Hoopers Farmhouse Bakeries Jumbo Raspberry Swiss Roll (£1.00, 1pk)
- x1 White Chocolate 2 finger Kit Kat bars (£1.50, 9pk)
- x1 carton of Ambrosia Devon Custard (£1.25, 1kg)
- For the boozy option x1 Bottle of Veroni Amaretto
 Original (£5.50, 50cl)

Prep time – 1 hour, 10 minutes



Iceland's version



Jemma's Version

Method

- 1. Empty the jelly pots into a saucepan and add the juice of 1 lemon. Gently melt the jelly over a medium heat until smooth and set aside to cool
- 2. Slice the Jumbo Swiss roll into 2.5cm slices and place upright around the bottom edge of the trifle dish, so the swirl is visible. Use the remaining Swiss roll to fill in the middle and any gaps, ensuring that it is level with the slices that line the edge
- 3. Once the jelly is cool, pour it over the Swiss roll and place in the fridge for an hour to set.
- 4. Slice 5 of the almond fingers in half lengthways and place on top of the jelly.
- 5. Pour the custard over the almond sponge ensuring a nice, even layer
- 6. Scatter the drained mandarin segments around the edges of the trifle dish, set 10 aside for decoration and place the remaining evenly around the dish.
- 7. Lightly wipe the cream to soft peaks and then fold in the lemon curd. Place in a piping bag and decorate or simply smooth over to create a nice even layer.
- 8. Crumble over the remaining 2 almond biscuits, scatter the mandarin segments and chop four of the Kit Kat bars into triangular shards to finish the decoration.



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
