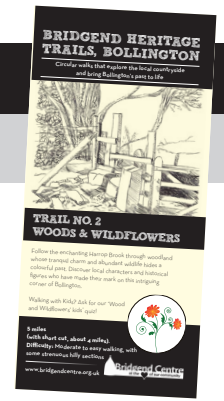


# Bridgend Heritage Walks Bollington

## Woods and Windflowers

### How to use this quiz

There are many along the side of Hedgerow. 4. There are two monkeys, a boar and some horses. They're silent because they're made of stone. 5. Caleb Jodrell's nickname was 'The Midnight Milkman' because after he'd finished working in his mine, he would milk his cows, even if it was at night-time. 6. There are lots of oak trees in Harrop Wood, you're sure to spot one. 7. Mr Allaby fell onto his bag of rabbits! 8. Who played the best tune? 9. There are lots of wildflowers to see from springtime. Check out their different colours. In May keep an eye out for bluebells. 10. It's said that the Black Prince bred Shire horses for war horses at Further Harrop Farm. 11. Silver birch trees have the pale, papery bark. 12. You might see sheep and lots of ducks as you pass Berristall Hall Farm.

11. Can you spot the trees with the pale, papery bark? What are they called?
12. What type of creatures can you see as you pass by Berristall Hall Farm?



### For the adults

This quiz is just a sample of things you could look for or do along the walk. Some other ideas to help the young walker enjoy the countryside:

- encourage them to look, touch, listen and smell their surroundings
- 'I spy' or alphabet games - can they find something that smells beginning with 'A', see something beginning with 'B' and so on
- Language skills - 'is it a twig? No it's a rusty brown gnarled branch!', find something bigger, smaller, longer, taller, rougher, smoother.
- Numeracy skills - count stones, steps, trees. How many stones can you hold? More than me or less than me? Who can walk faster, slower, how many steps in one minute? Find examples of symmetry in nature.
- Bring an old envelope to carry home 'treasures' you may find to display when you get home and talk about and recall again and again!
